(An ANIMAL REPORTER, decked out in safari gear, reports live from a "safari" where he chronicles the activities of some wild animals.)

[NOTE: This scene could be filmed outside in a local park or backyard, if possible.]

ANIMAL REPORTER

Thanks for the weather update. I've got a special segment for all you thrill-seekers! I'm reporting live from the natural habitat of one of the world's most dangerous wild animals. Brace yourselves. What you're about to see is not for the faint of heart.

(ANIMAL REPORTER turns the camera to reveal the animal.)

[NOTE: This animal can be played by the actor's pet or by a stuffed animal.]

Ah! There she is – the fiercest creature in the animal kingdom! And look at those fangs – enough venom to take down an elephant! Terrifying. Let's see how close we can get.

(ANIMAL REPORTER gets right next to the animal's face; it's the ultimate close-up. He lowers his voice so as not to disturb the "predator.")

Remember, I'm a professional. If you see a predator like this, do not approach! This sure puts the awesome in Super Happy Awesome News.

(ANIMAL REPORTER struggles to tame the "wild" beast.)

Whoa! Stay back! Stay back! Sorry viewers, I gotta go wrangle this beast!

Over to sports!

(Joey's younger sibling, PARKER, interrupts the broadcast. PARKER reports from his own bedroom, which is next door to Joey's.)

PARKER

Hey everybody! Remember Joey, that news anchor from before? Well, she happens to be my older sister. I asked if I could be her co-anchor, but she said her news desk is too small for both of us. Too bad, right? Fortunately, I know the password to all her accounts (it's "JoeysAwesome1234" in case you were wondering) so I can just report from my bedroom! Anyhoo, I just wanted to say hi to all of you.

(PARKER gets close to the camera and waves exuberantly.)

Hiiiiii!!!!!

(Suddenly, banging erupts on the other side of the wall.)

Keep it down, Joey! I'm recording! Gosh, some people are so intrusive.

(We see JOEY banging on the wall that separates her room from Parker's.)

JOEY

Parker! Get off the air!

(JOEY turns around and notices the camera is on.)

Oh, we're live!

(JOEY runs over to the news desk and takes a seat. She immediately adopts a super professional demeanor.)

[NOTE: Joey can press play on the underscoring as she sits down.]

Welcome back to Super Happy Awesome News! Sorry about that annoying interruption. I assure you it won't happen again. Only super happy expert contributors are allowed on this network!

And absolutely no younger siblings!

(JOEY glares at the wall separating her room from Parker's, then turns back to the camera with a professional smile.)

After the break, we'll be back with the news that makes everyone happiest: politics! But first, a word from our sponsors.

(In this commercial, A SALESPERSON stands in her kitchen and addresses the camera.)

SPICY WATER SALESPERSON

You know how water is super good for you, but it's also super tasteless? Well now, you can spice up your water with Spicy Water!

(She holds up a pepper shaker with a homemade label that reads "Spicy Water.")

What's Spicy Water, you ask? Well, thanks for inquiring! Spicy Water is your one-stop shop for de-bore-ify-ing your water. It's a fine black spice that comes in a cute, little shaker like this. Just add it to your water and stir! Now, I know what you're thinking: that looks an awful lot like pepper. Well, aren't you silly?! It may look like pepper, but it's not pepper — It's Spicy Water! See, it has a totally different label and everything! And it tastes delicious.

Let's give it a try. You just shake it directly into your glass of plain ol' water, like so.

(She shakes the pepper into the water.)

Easy right? And then you stir and taste!

(She stirs in the pepper, tastes the concoction, then winces.)

Mmmmm. Yum. Spicy. You'd better act fast. At just \$29.99, these bottles are flying off the shelf. So get your pepper – I mean, your Spicy Water – today!

(POLITICS REPORTER 1 reports live. He wears a suit and an earpiece.)

[NOTE: The setting and political references can be swapped out so they correspond to your country. If set in the United States, this reporter may stand in front of a digital backdrop of the Capitol Building in Washington, D.C.]

[NOTE: You may want to include chyrons (the captions that appear on the bottom of your screen during a news program) in the following scenes. These captions can be added to the video using the title feature in iMovie. The chyron in this scene might read, "SUPER HAPPY AWESOME NEWS: THE ORIGINAL HAPPY NEWS

NETWORK!"]
